Next Adult Ed Class

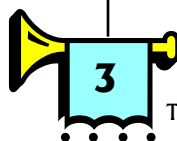
April through June

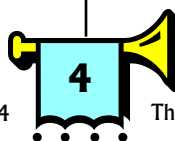
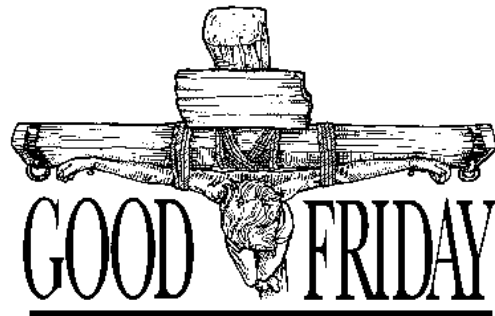

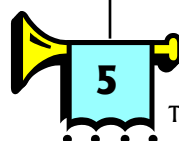


Women's Ministry Conference

Let's Make His Praise Glorious

Psalm 66:2 declares "Sing forth the honor of his name: make his praise glorious." And in Romans 12:1 we are urged to "present your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God, which is your spiritual worship." We're here for the Glory of God! We're here to "make His praise glorious!" What a privilege!

An important side note: some translations think they are making it easier for us by translating Romans 12:1, "present your bodies as living sacrifices," so everything flows and both "bodies" and "sacrifices" are plural. We read then that each one of us should individually offer our body as a living sacrifice. That may be implied in Romans 12:1, but that is NOT what the text actually says! In the original Greek language, from which our English translations come, it reads "Present your bodies (plural) A LIVING SACRIFICE (singular)." This is a call to worship God as a church, a community, the Body of Christ as a single whole act of worship!

A second observation: Psalm 66:2 more than suggests we can "make His praise glorious" by "singing forth the honor of His Name." So, while we know that we worship

God with our lives and our lips in many ways, when we gather for corporate worship, we should be thinking about how we can with our singing, with our music, to make His praise glorious. This is exciting!

With the departure of Matthew Little as Director of Music, La Mar and I and others are assisting with helping to take our corporate worship experience, particularly the music, to the next level of excellence and spiritual intensity, to "make His praise glorious." But remember the "sacrifice" (singular) comes from the "bodies" (plural) when we join together for the very purpose of making His praise glorious.

So please consider these requests:

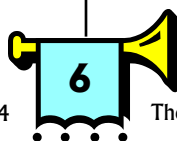
1) Think of your top 10 (or five or three) hymns or praise songs—the ones you'd love to sing in a worship service, and let me know what those songs are. You can write the names of the songs on a connect card and place them in the offering plate on a Sunday, or hand the list to La Mar Owens or me directly, send an email to pastordaleandtara@gmail.com, or call or text me at 209-718-6130

2) If you love to sing, consider joining our choir or our Celebration band. Feel free to come to a rehearsal on Wednesdays at 6:15, or let us know if you have questions and we can have a conversation. Singing in the choir is an amazing way to participate in "making His praise glorious." By the way, if transportation is an issue for evening activities, we are quite willing to arrange for you to get a ride.

3) If you play an instrument, please let us know. We would so love to explore with you how you can be part of "making His praise glorious" at Trinity United. This includes young people who are learning to play an instrument—not just adults.

4) Finally, each time you come to worship, remember this is not entertainment for us. This is for God's pleasure. He is the audience. We're gathering to make His praise glorious! And in the process, we may just find our hearts and minds filled with the joy, peace, and love of the Lord.

Reports from the Field

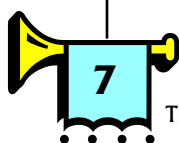

We recently received a postcard from Modesto's own Todd and Sarah Hunnicutt. They are missionaries to Slovenia, a tiny country located northeast of Italy and south of Austria. Protestants make up less than 2% of the population. As a former Communist country, there is still a spiritual darkness there. They wrote: “Thank you so much for your support, which helped us to be able to rent a house near the freeway, which makes it easy to be used for ministry... As the Lord leads, we have many plans to use the house for Him!” They ask for prayer for several church leaders who are having family and/or burnout issues. As well, they desire prayer for planning for the ‘Slovenian Evangelical Partnership’ movement, which is bringing together over 20 churches. Their vision is to grow people in the skills and desire to do evangelism and church planting.

Modesto Pregnancy Center's Executive Director Erin Koolhaas recently wrote a thank you for our support. She said that they had gotten encouraging news from a recent visitor. The young woman was getting an ultrasound while the staff was playing with her young son ‘Ezekiel.’ It turned out that she had been there before when she was pregnant with Ezekiel. After meeting with them and seeing him on the ultrasound screen, she fell in love and chose life for him! She was very happy to have the new ultrasound confirm her second pregnancy.

Lo McDermott, another person raised in Modesto, is now an Area Director for InterVarsity Christian Fellowship, which ministers to college students across the country. She thanks us for our generous support of her local college campus ministry. Two college students, both young women named Jackie, had their stories told in her recent newsletter. They were struggling with faith and feeling isolated yet had enough faith to go to InterVarsity's fall conference. They

were standing next to each other when they both responded to an invitation to accept Jesus at the camp. One told Lo, “The community (at the camp) was so warm and welcoming. I loved every bit of it: worship, the things we talked about, and how everyone was able to connect with each other and with God.”

Paradise, Chapter Four

Fundraising Brunch
Sunday, March 10, Telle Center
11:30 AM after worship

Community lunch programs, gem and mineral shows, bean feeds put on by the Rotary Club, choral concerts, performances by the local symphony orchestra: six years ago, and roadside advertisements for events like these were signs of life in Paradise, California. Six years ago, in March 2018, life bordered on the idyllic in the peaceful mountaintop town. One year later, life in Paradise would never be the same.

Sheryl Fakhouri and Don Munro were among the over 26,000 Paradise residents who will never forget the morning of Thursday, November 8, 2018. A strong wind was blowing in from the east, funneling down the Feather River Canyon past the Poe Powerhouse and the riverside hamlet of Pulga. Sparks had been reported coming from a Pacific Gas & Electric 115,000-volt transmission line on Camp Road

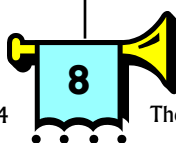
two miles out of town the day before. When the wind began gusting at 50 miles per hour that Thursday morning, worn-out components on the 97-year-old Caribou-Palermo power line failed.

An hour later, the dark cloud building behind Paradise that Fakhouri and Munro initially thought to be much-needed rain turned out to be the deadliest wildfire in California’s history. Fakhouri barely had time to gather her family at their home on Jewell Road and drive out of town. Fire burning all around them, their car windshield was broken by the heat, and the family barely escaped alive.

Next-door neighbor Don Munro wasn’t able to get out in time. Sheltering in place on the ground outside his home, mouth and nose an inch off the dirt, the only place where he could find breathable air, Munro watched a massive fireball roll down the streambed of Honey Run into the “little Grand Canyon” of Butte Creek. Beyond the reality of knowing he could die at any moment; the Vietnam veteran found the experience to be strangely beautiful. Other residents trapped in Paradise and neighboring Magalia weren’t so fortunate. 86 people died; 11,000 homes were lost.

Five years later, over 2,900 homes have been rebuilt—just under a third of the homes in the process of being permitted and rebuilt. Two of the completed homes belong to Don and Sheryl, where our Trinity United Presbyterian Disaster Assistance team worked in 2023. It’s a special honor for us to meet the homeowners we’re helping and last year was extra special. The day Sheryl visited the site we were in the midst of painting and other finishing work. Sheryl’s reaction to seeing the progress was immediate and emotional. “We’ve been living out back in a mobile home without heat or air-conditioning for five years,” she said through tears. “Now I can tell everyone we’re going to be home in a few weeks.”

Going home was a feeling many Trinity United PDA team members shared in 2023. Slow, steady progress has marked our past three mission trips to the Paradise area. Starting on Sunday, April 14, and continuing



into Saturday, April 20, we'll be writing Chapter Four in the ongoing success story. Once again, our team will be housed at the "other Trinity"—Trinity Presbyterian Church, Oroville. For the second time in four years, we'll be working with Tiny Pine, where our Paradise ministry began in 2021.

We're looking forward to reuniting with Alyssa Hofman at Tiny Pine, both at the distribution center in Oroville and on location at three different work sites in Butte County where tiny homes are being built on permanent foundations. There will be a wide range of work options available along with an outstanding manager who knows our team. Knowing Alyssa, we expect a wide array of fun in the tasks that await us.

To learn more about PDA's 2024 mission outreach, you're invited to join us for brunch in the Telle Center on Sunday, March 10 at 11:30 AM. We'll share stories and images from the 2023 mission trip as well as plans for this year's outreach. As always, there's no charge for the event; a freewill offering will be available. Be sure to bring plenty of questions and enthusiasm! We'll do our best to answer the former and joyfully join in the latter.

Signs and slogans are one thing—hard work is something else. While we all wear blue shirts, it's the people inside those shirts and our Trinity United family back home, who truly help to bring hope out of chaos.

None of this would be possible without the incredible amount of support we continue to enjoy from the Trinity United church family. Your donations have helped to provide necessary supplies for construction in the Paradise area. Beyond that, your prayers of support make all the difference, as they have since our PDA mission outreach began in 2007. We wouldn't leave home without them, and we haven't for the past 16 years.

Signups for brunch will continue to be held before and after worship on Sunday, March 3.

See you at the brunch on Sunday, March 10.

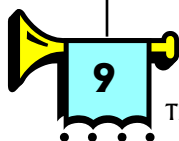

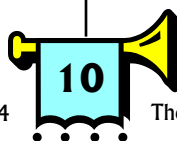
Journeys of the Apostle Paul Biblical Tour and Cruise
