I have volunteered to bring a simple message to our preschool kids every Wednesday at 10 am.

At first, I thought this would be a piece of cake, these kids are the same age as my grandkids, and I like my grandkids. I thought this would be an easy thing to do—spend a few minutes telling them a Bible story with a message, get some high-fives and hugs, and go back to work. Oh boy did I underestimate what this simple task consisted of? First, once all 30 or so of the 2 to 4-year-olds find your buttons, they will press them all at once. Now they have learned that

I am a bit playful and so they see me as a license to laugh and yell and the like. Second, they swarm me when they give their parting high-fives and hugs. Now, I had no idea that could be so powerful, but it is the difference between being hit by a gentle stream of water and being hit by a renegade ocean wave. But it is a wonderful wave to be sure. To have a bunch of preschool kids hooting and fist bumping and hugging you around the neck will give your spirit a lift. Now being theologically educated for so many years means absolutely nothing to that group of pups. It is hard to take our theological concepts and make them meaningful without being scary or

alarming to 3-year-olds. In an adult setting, I can say Jesus loved you so much he went to the cross for you, but that is not the easiest thing to say to a preschooler. You must settle on just the "God loves you" part. They like that we sing "Jesus Loves Me" almost every time we meet. Now, this last week I wanted to tell them how much Jesus wants us to help others, especially others in need, so I settled upon the Good Samaritan parable, and from the start I knew I could not be as open with the story as Jesus was. How do you tell the little ones that an innocent man was robbed and beaten, all his

valuables were taken, and he was left for dead? How do you tell them a priest and a Levite, the "righteous religionists" saw him and just kept on walking? How do you communicate the social juxtaposition Jesus embraced when he said it was a Samaritan-you know, the despised half-Jew, with the bad theology, who stopped to help and to heal a stranger? This is a visceral parable, with evil out front, corrupt religion center stage, and a stranger's compassion to the rescue.

All I could tell these young ones was Jesus wants us to help others, and so he told a story about a man who helped another man whom others hurt. That might just be the perfect synopsis. Now grown-ups, yes, I am speaking to you, you know that Jesus told this story when He was asked insincerely by a pharisee, "Who is my neighbor?" No doubt looking for a loophole in the law. Luke wrote "But he wanted to justify himself, so he asked Jesus, "And who is my neighbor?" Jesus told the story and then asked the Pharisee, "Which of these three do you think was a neighbor to the man who fell into the hands of robbers?" The expert in the law replied, "The one who had mercy on him." Jesus told him, "Go and do likewise."

Bad Religion it seems has a way of giving us permission to help some and bypass others, and to feel justified in doing so. The same Jesus that has commanded us to love our enemies and to bless those that curse us, has instructed us brilliantly in this dynamic parable. And no matter how you parse the Greek, no matter how you drag this parable through whatever filter you have, the message is the same one I gave to the precious little ones on Wednesday, "God wants you to help everyone in need." Childlike faith is not complicated, grown-up faith certainly can be. May the spirit of Christ remind each of us that love means love, help means help and everyone in need means everyone in need. To quote the Mandalorian who stole a line from Jesus, "This is the way!"

And big blessings and a great big shout out to all our preschool teachers and workers who are experts at loving these kids. Thank them when you see them.

My name is Donald Jepson. I am an Elder on Session. I became a member of Trinity United back in 1968. I became a Christian in 1967 when I was 20 years old. I finished elementary school at Beard Elementary and went to Roosevelt Jr. High. I graduated in 1959. We moved back to Kansas for two years while my dad built missile bases for the Air Force. I attended Dickenson County Community High School my Freshman and Sophomore years. I played football and golf. I really enjoyed golf. In 1962, my dad's missile base project ended and we moved back to Modesto. I enrolled in Thomas Downey High School. I majored in science. Also, I played football and lettered in golf. I graduated in 1964.

I enrolled at MJC the following year. My major was Chemistry. I met Kathy at MJC and we had a really nice group of friends with whom I still stay in touch. I transferred to Stanislaus State in 1967. I majored in Chemistry and have the first Bachelor's degree in Chemistry conferred by Stanislaus. Also, a group of us golfers started the first NCAA golf team at Stanislaus. Kathy and I got engaged in 1968, I had accepted Christ and joined Trinity United that


