The Wright Angle

No Favoritism — Not Even the Reverse Kind

If you know me at all, you know I don't exactly linger in the Old Testament book of Leviticus. Just writing the word gives me pause and makes me want to shout how grateful I am to be living on this side of the new covenant. We Presbyterians celebrate that we are saved by grace through faith alone—not by works (or laws), lest anyone should boast. So yes, I spend more time in Romans than in Leviticus.

That is, until I stumbled across a verse last week that I didn't even know was in the Bible (and you thought I had it all memorized! Not even close). The verse is Leviticus 19:15:

"Do not show partiality to the poor or favoritism to the great, but judge your neighbor fairly."

This caught me off guard.

We've been studying the book of James in our Adult Sunday School class, and James is very direct about our commitment to the poor and the dangers of favoritism. He pulls no punches—and neither did Jesus. But this verse from Leviticus adds a new and striking angle: it warns us not to favor the poor at the expense of others. Could it be that in our passion to honor the vulnerable, we might actually neglect the rest?

Leviticus would say yes.

Taking from the "haves" to give to the "have-nots" may sound like justic—ust ask Robin Hood and his merry men—but ask the millions displaced by systems like socialism and communism (that used this very rubric to justify power grabs), and you'll find injustice on a massive scale. Scripture's concern isn't forced redistribution—it's fairness. God is after equality in judgment, not the favoring of one group over another.

"Do not show favoritism in judgment—either to the poor or to the rich."

Okay, Pastor... is this a political newsletter article? Not in the least.

This is a reflection I believe could shape how we engage church growth—and one another—here at Trinity.

Let me put it this way: when someone enters our church with visible physical needs, and we

reach out with compassion, that deeply honors Christ. But when someone else walks in who appears polished, self-sufficient, and “put together,” and we assume they’re fine — so we don’t extend ourselves to welcome them—that’s also partiality. It’s just harder to spot.

Scripture never instructs us to pick a demographic to favor. It commands us to love all with equal measure.

Some people who enter our doors look like they have everything—but on the inside, they’re barely holding it together. They may have all the trappings of success—the smile, the outfit, the confidence—but their soul is aching for belonging. They came not for coffee or even the sermon—they came because they’re looking for a family. For love. For meaning. For connection.

Helping those with obvious needs will always honor Christ. But failing to engage those whose needs are invisible—that’s a tragic oversight.

Jesus was the champion of the poor and downtrodden, yes—but He also spent time with Nicodemus, a wealthy Pharisee, and offered living water to a woman at a well who was socially isolated, not economically impoverished. He called Zacchaeus down from the tree—a rich man whose real poverty was relational. Jesus ministered to the full spectrum of human need, and not all of it looked like financial lack.

Imagine this: a couple walks into church, dressed in designer clothes, smiling and laughing through the narthex. Most folks assume they’re doing great—and they are warmly greeted, but no one digs deeper. A few weeks later, after someone finally asks how they are really doing, the wife breaks down in tears. They had lost a child the year before. They were drowning in grief, and this was their last-ditch effort to find hope. “We look like we have it together,” she says, “but we’ve never been more broken.”

That moment could change the way we think about first impressions.

So, let me ask you: Is there someone in your life whom you’ve placed on a pedestal? Someone you think doesn’t need anything from Christ or from the church? What if you’re wrong?

Maybe you could pray for them this week. And when the time is right, ask:

“What do you need—from Christ, from this church, from me?”

If they say, “Oh, nothing, I’m good!” — ask again.

Ordination Retreat Reflections **May 6-9, 2025**

This past month, I attended the first of two ordination retreats for candidates in the ECO ordination process. As some of you may know (or maybe not!), I've been on the path toward ordination for quite a while now. Along the way, I've hit pause, hesitated, and recalibrated, mostly due to changes in my own life, in our church, and in the ordination process itself. But I'm learning that God's timing is everything. Attending this retreat was a significant and encouraging step forward, and I'm thankful for it.



The retreat was three days of learning, assessment, connection, and reflection. Each candidate is in a different place in the process depending on their current ministry role and educational background. Because I've been in ministry for many years and already hold seminary degrees, my remaining steps are fewer than some. Still, the retreat wasn't just about checking boxes—it was about preparing us for lifelong service to Christ and His Church and doing so from a place of emotional and spiritual health.

A Lesson in Waiting

Travel, of course, always comes with its own lessons. Before the retreat even began, I found myself in a familiar dance at the airport: "hurry up and wait." Determined not to miss my flight, I arrived early (so early, in fact, that the ticket counter hadn't even opened yet!) With little sleep the night before, I was groggy but calm. There was no traffic, no rush. I even dozed a little on the way. While others at the airport bustled about, I was strangely settled, sipping my coffee and easing into the day. And then, of course, came the notification: our flight was delayed by several hours.

Initially, I felt frustration rise. But then I remembered: I was already there, already prepared. And more importantly, I had the time and space to slow down.

In many ways, that's been the story of my ordination journey. It has involved plenty of delays, detours, and seasons of quiet waiting. I've known since I was seven years old that I was called to be a pastor. That sense of call has never wavered. And yet, there have been seasons when I simply wasn't ready in one way or another emotionally, spiritually, or circumstantially.

One thing I've appreciated about ECO is their commitment to preparing pastors not only theologically, but holistically. They want to see pastors who are healthy... who are grounded, aware, and maturing in Christ. Not perfect, but intentional. Not just busy with ministry, but shaped by the Spirit.

The Practice of Rest

Many of you have done well to establish a healthy rhythm between work, family, and rest. I, however, am still learning (and relearning) how to find that balance. One of my personal goals during this season is to deepen my spiritual discipline of rest—beginning with honoring the Sabbath, but also learning how to say "yes" and "no" with discernment.

As an extrovert, rest doesn't always come naturally to me. I tend to fill my schedule and thrive on connection. But I'm realizing that rest isn't just about absence of activity, it's about presence with God. And when I rush through life, even spiritual life, I often miss the gifts God wants to give me in the waiting.

So instead of resenting the delays, I'm learning to see them as invitations. The Lord is inviting me to trust His pace, His timing, and His process... not just for ordination, but for life.

Whether you find yourself in a season of activity or a season of waiting, I pray you'll also sense the Lord's invitation to slow down, rest, and lean into His grace.

COMMUNITY FOOD DISTRIBUTION

Basket of Hope on Wings of Angels

Here's a different view of Basket of Hope for those who may be unaware that the first "baskets" packed each month are labeled and delivered to food-insecure patients and families who are receiving services from Community Hospice & Health Services of Modesto. This unique partnership between our two organizations is now in its second year. It was born when we discovered that some of our families on Hospice Service were in need and this was a natural connection. Social workers at Community Hospice provide a list of names of those in need with family size and zip code (ensuring Stanislaus County residence) to Trinity's church office and Friends of Community Hospice Committee members before the middle of the month so all are on board. To protect confidentiality, we have developed a process that allows us to put correct labels on the Baskets for delivery. All involved keep the confidentiality covenant.

When the June 2025 list came in, it originally had 26 families listed—a goodly amount of folks in need. Then one more was added. And then another! When that increased our number to 47 family members which would mean 33 Baskets, my first thought was, "I need to call Don Jepson! He'll be so excited to have this many to help!" ... then I caught myself and

I smiled, realizing he already knew because he is watching over it all!

Since Don and I brought Trinity United and Community Hospice together in March 2023, we have served 1,614 Hospice patients and families—bringing them life-sustaining food, packed with love and laughter, prayers and joy, and the presence of our Lord in every Basket. One young woman told me, as her husband of 45 lay on his final bed in their living room, and who was the primary provider for their family of four, including two young children, that "Basket of Hope is a bright spot on a dark day."

Every Basket each of you pack brings hope to someone you may never know but whose life you are changing with your love. I, the patients and families you serve, and Friends of Community Hospice & Health Services, thank you so very much. And I know Don is smiling down on the whole wonderful, noisy, sometimes chaotic, and always beautiful bunch of you!

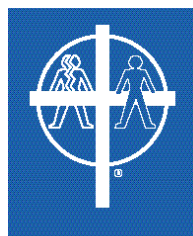
