I cannot even begin to describe how exciting the soft launch of our new tutoring and mentoring program was this past month. New and old faces all came together and smiled, laughed, played games, and even learned a little bit!

I want to tell you a little bit about our model from both a ministry and an educational standpoint (my two passions). My goal for this new ministry is for volunteers to work with one student, get to know them personally, meet their family, find out what they like and dislike about school, hear about the things they love and things they struggle with, and, through all of that, find ways to encourage them and show them Christ's LOVE! Educationally speaking, I can tell you that 85% of young people who have a solid, meaningful connection with a mentor will see positive changes and success in education. Practically speaking, for the life and mission of the church, I can tell you from my own experience growing up at Trinity how many amazing mentors gave my life purpose and mission! I have seen, time and again, at several churches how building connections with students has changed not just their lives but their families' as well.

And let me tell you, this is not a hard or difficult task! We read books and discuss them. We practice adding and times tables (nothing too tricky!). And we play games that encourage speaking and critical thinking skills, Connect Four and Guess Who are some favorites. We have fun and interact, and it makes such a difference in the life of a child, in the life of their family, and, dare I say, in the life of those who tutor! Building connections and relationships is so meaningful! And isn't that what Jesus commanded us to do? The greatest commandment: love God. Have and build a relationship with God. The second greatest commandment? Love your neighbor! Have and build a relationship with your neighbors. Let the love of God shine through you to them!

The most exciting thing about the last few Wednesdays, to me, was seeing students welcomed and loved on. To see them leave smiling, excited to come back, and asking to invite their friends! This is God at work in our church and in our neighborhood and I cannot wait to see where it will go!

The Wright Angle

Spring Greetings, Church Family!

The Torah emphasizes that Passover is celebrated in the springtime. In fact, the Hebrew month when Passover occurs is called Aviv, meaning "spring." This is deeply significant because spring symbolizes rebirth, renewal, and the restoration of life. After the cold of winter, what appeared dormant or dead bursts forth into vibrant new life—and this imagery beautifully captures the essence of Passover.

Historically, Passover commemorates the dramatic deliverance of the Israelites from slavery in Egypt. As told in Exodus 12, each Hebrew household placed the blood of an unblemished lamb upon their doorposts, a sign causing the Angel of Death to "pass over" their homes, sparing their firstborn sons. This powerful event marked Israel's passage from bondage to freedom, from despair to hope, and from death to life.

In February, we brought in \$47,131 and spent \$60,147. This left us with a deficit of -\$13,016 for the month. However, thanks to our December surplus, we still have \$11,350 remaining to date.

Yet, this ancient story foreshadows an even greater event: the coming of the Messiah, Jesus Christ, the ultimate Passover Lamb. John the Baptist recognized Jesus as "the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world!" (John 1:29). Indeed, generations after the first Passover, God Himself took on flesh and became the perfect, spotless Lamb whose sacrifice would extend far beyond the redemption of Israel—it would reach to every nation, tribe, and tongue.

Just as spring brings life after winter, the world, dormant under the grip of sin and death, awakened anew through Christ's sacrifice. Reflecting upon this at Good Friday, we remember Christ's profound sacrifice. However, Jesus did not remain in the grave. His resurrection is the very embodiment of spring's promise—new and everlasting life. As He declared, "I am the resurrection and the life. Whoever believes in me, though he die, yet shall he live" (John 11:25).

The Torah intentionally aligns Passover with spring to remind us annually that God is in the business of renewal and resurrection. Just as flowers bloom and fields come alive in spring, our souls too experience renewal and rebirth through the risen Lamb.

May this spring season fill your hearts with fresh hope, renewed faith, and abundant joy as we celebrate together the risen Christ—the eternal Lamb who brings everlasting spring.

May our church prayerfully remember the past, celebrate those who gave us such a magnificent foundation, and then rise to new life—springing up to become those who joyfully follow Christ into a great harvest! Winter is over; let new life begin.

On March 14, we had the opportunity to attend a free Christian hip-hop night hosted by Youth for Christ. (A HUGE shoutout to Trevor Stroud for driving the bus and getting our youth there!) None of our students or leaders had ever been to a rap concert before. Rick even joked that he could always turn his hearing aid down if it got too loud! But as the night unfolded, I watched our students not just be entertained but truly hear the message of the Gospel in a fresh, impactful way.

EGR (Extra Grace Required), a local Christian rap artist, shared through music, Scripture, testimony, and poetry that no matter our mistakes or how much we feel



like outsiders, God still has a purpose for us. His grace covers our flaws. I witnessed many of our students deeply moved, and four of them took significant steps of faith—either dedicating their lives to Jesus for the first time or recommitting to following Him.

One thing EGR emphasized was the importance of sharing our "I've been there" stories. Young people today feel immense pressure to have everything together. They need to hear that they're not alone in their struggles. Our testimonies matter. When we sit with others, listen to their stories, and offer the hope of Jesus, it makes a difference. Don't let a genre of music, a style of clothing, or a generational gap stop you from sharing what God has done and is doing in your life—you never know the impact it may have!

Gracious Lord, we are so grateful for the ways You are moving in the lives of our students. May they encounter Your presence in fresh and personal ways.
