## The Wright Angle

## Greetings, Church Family,

Call me crazy, but I read opposing opinions in the news every day. I try to approach them with an open mind and a humble heart. Often, the same story is reported through different eyes, and—no surprise—the conclusions land at opposite poles.

One of the most divisive conversations right now is about those crossing our southern border and seeking asylum. It's true that our asylum laws were designed as a legal and humanitarian effort to provide refuge to people fleeing systemic oppression. It's also true that some use those same laws to delay deportation or navigate a broken system.

But here's what makes me uneasy: when a humanitarian crisis becomes politicized, the people at the center of it—the ones actually in crisis—are often dehumanized.

I would make a poor politician for a very simple reason: I am too narrowly focused. While I make a point of reading widely, I have spent years cultivating what I half-jokingly call tunnel vision. That's because, as a pastor, I've vowed to view life through the eyes of Christ. This isn't always easy. But it's my calling. And when it comes to shaping my worldview, I don't care what media commentators or political strategists have to say. I refuse to let partisan voices set the agenda for my faith.

My goal—my daily struggle—is to allow the Holy Spirit within me and the Scripture on my lap to shape my words, my thinking, and my preaching. Of course, I still have political opinions; I'm a thinking, voting citizen. But in the pulpit and in my role as pastor, those opinions must take a back seat. My task is to shine the light of Christ into the darkness, not fan the flames of division. So here's my invitation: I encourage every follower of Jesus to stay informed. Listen to a wide variety of voices. Pay attention to what's happening in the world. But when you are face-to-face with a child of God—whether that person is an immigrant, an asylum seeker, someone without housing, someone struggling with addiction, or anyone in crisis—I urge you, by the mercies of God, to put on a holy kind of tunnel vision. See them as Christ sees them: beloved.

Summer camps are always a special highlight for teenagers in the church, and Calvin Crest is no exception. Each year brings a fresh wave of meaningful moments and lasting memories, but there's something uniquely sacred about a place so deeply woven into the history and heart of Trinity United. Every time I step onto the Calvin Crest property, I'm struck by the beauty of God's creation—and even more so, by His mighty hand at work in the lives of every camper.



This summer wasn't wildly different or out of the ordinary... but it was special. The energy of first-time campers meeting the wonder of the woods, paired with the joy of returning students stepping back into a place they love, created a buzz of excitement that could be felt across both weeks. One key reason this experience continues to thrive is the faithful leadership of Joshua Kerr, one of our very own from Trinity United. Since joining the Calvin Crest staff, Joshua—alongside Executive Director Tiffany Staman—has helped shape a culture focused on intentional discipleship. The team they've built is one that pours into campers and leaders alike: spiritually, emotionally, mentally, and physically. As both a youth pastor and a cabin leader, I've seen firsthand how deeply they care for every person who steps onto that mountain.

One word that kept rising to the surface for me this summer was unity. I saw it in the leaders, the students, the cabins, the teams, and even in how churches came together. One moment stands out vividly: a team-building challenge with our high school girls. The goal was to get the entire group from one platform to another using just two boards, with only two girls allowed to touch them, and no one allowed to speak. Seven girls from our church participated, along with one student from another Modesto church who is now interested in visiting Trinity United!

At first, they didn't complete the challenge. But when they returned to it later, one student shared a reflection that stuck with me: "It can't happen when we're acting like two different teams when we're supposed to be one." That simple, profound statement has stayed with me. It's true for team-building games, but it's even more true in our churches and communities. We can't move forward if we're not moving forward together.

Each cabin leader is asked to reflect at the end of the week: "In what ways have you seen your campers grow in discipleship?" It's a beautiful question and I think it's one we should ask ourselves too. How have I grown in my walk with Christ this week? In what areas do I need to grow? And how can I come alongside others on that journey?

And in a way, that question "How am I growing?" echoes the heart of our theme this year: FOUND. Just like the father in the parable of the Prodigal Son, God meets us with open arms wherever we've been. Whether we feel like the one who wandered or the one who stayed, our growth comes not from striving alone, but from being found in His love. This summer, I saw students rediscover their identity in Christ, not because of a mountaintop moment alone, but because they were reminded they belong. They are seen, known, and welcomed... just as they are.

If we want to be united in purpose, growing in faith, and becoming more like Christ, we need to keep showing up: for one another, for our church, and for God. And sometimes that starts with simply asking the question: How am I being discipled, and how am I helping others grow, too?
